



- All children are to be supervised at all times to prevent altercations, damages to another person's property (such as vehicles/items on porches), and to ensure the child's safety when outside. Parents are responsible for damages caused by children and guests.
- Please ensure toys and yard items are picked up after kids play with them, or we will pick them up and dispose of them. We cannot cut grass if toys are left outside as they can cause damages to the lawnmowers. Fines will be added to accounts that require us to pick up the toys.
- Tenants should respect their neighbors and keep noise to a minimum. Between the hours of 10pm-7am outside noise should be omitted, and inside noise should be kept down.
- Housing Authority staff are not the local police enforcement. We can not stress this enough!! Tenants are instructed to call the police anytime an emergency exists. This includes altercations between neighbors. Then contact your housing manager regarding the situations/disturbances.



Fire prevention week October 8-14 2023

Cooking brings family and friends together, provides an outlet for creativity and can be relaxing. But did you know that cooking fires are the number one cause of home fires and home injuries? By following a few safety tips you can prevent these fires. Safety "Cook with Caution" • Be on alert! If you are sleepy or have consumed alcohol don't use the stove or stovetop. • Stay in the kitchen while you are frying, boiling, grilling, or broiling food. If you leave the kitchen for even a short period of time, turn off the stove. • If you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, remain in the home while food is cooking, and use a timer to remind you that you are cooking. • Keep anything that can catch fire — oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging, towels or curtains — away from your stovetop. If you have a small (grease) cooking fire and decide to fight the fire... • On the stovetop, smother the flames by sliding a lid over the pan and turning off the burner. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. • For an oven fire, turn off the heat and keep the door closed. If you have any doubt about fighting a small fire... • Just get out! When you leave, close the door behind you to help contain the fire. • Call 9-1-1 or the local emergency number from outside the home. Cooking and Kids Have a "kid-free zone" of at least 3 feet (1 metre) around the stove and areas where hot food or drink is prepared or carried.
